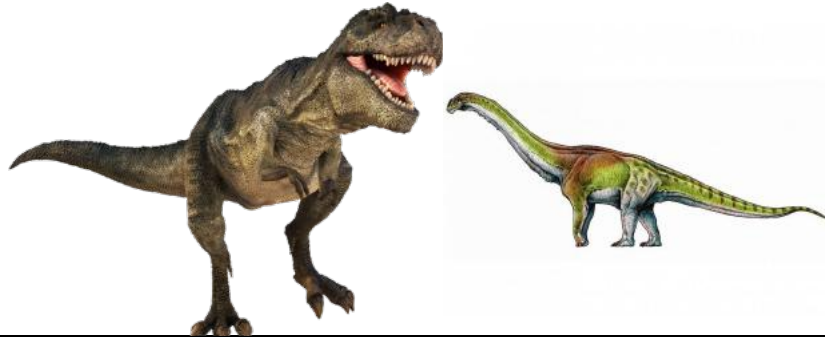
Dear Year 3 families,

| Reading | 5 x weekly Please read aloud from your school reading book and then your parents will complete the reading log book every time they have listened to you read. Please return both the log book and reading book to school on a daily basis. This is one way to help us track your reading progress. |
| Spellings | 3 x weekly Practise spellings from the Planet and/or Star words by 'Look Say Cover Write' method or any of the methods on the 'Spelling Menu' sheet. We are revising these words from Year 2. |
| Handwriting Practice | Please see the handwriting sheet given for this week. To be completed at home. |
| Mental Maths | 3 x weekly We will be revising the mental maths times tables. Learn the times tables/divisions that you have been given for the weekly times tables test. You can use TTRockstars. |
| Learn and Explore Activities | Some of you may wish to spend more time learning at home. So, we have written a menu of optional additional activities that you may wish to do. You could choose to do none, one or all of these activities during the half term. If you do an activity we would like you to email in a photograph or scanned image of your activity. Here is your menu of learn and explore activities this half term: <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Create a poster all about your favourite dinosaur2. Make a board game that includes dinosaurs3. Create a word search that includes words about fossils, rocks and soils4. Make some dinosaur shaped biscuits – remember to weigh the ingredients out carefully5. Ask your friends and families what their favourite dinosaur is and record your results on a pictograph6. Make a 3D model of a dinosaur |

7. Take your parents to visit the Natural History Museum in London or the Jurassic coast in Dorset
8. Write a story about a lost dinosaur
9. Make a set of Top Trumps about dinosaurs to play with your family and friends
10. Make a dinosaur 'dot to dot' for your friends to complete
