<p>English:</p> <p>Writing: <u>LI: To edit and publish a piece of writing</u></p> <p>Today, we would like you to edit and publish your work. We have done lots of this in class and you are all getting really good at it! If you don't have a green pen or pencil to edit, just grab one that is a different colour than what you used to write your story, it will make it a lot easier to see your corrections that way!</p> <p>Remember to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Add details, missing words, interesting words and description• Remove words and sentences that don't make sense• Move paragraphs, words or sentences for a better order.	

- Substitute boring words for interesting words, new words for overused words.
- Capital letters for I, proper nouns, start of every sentence, titles and subtitles
- Order- Check your story makes sense
- Punctuation: speech punctuation, commas after fronted adverbials, subordinate clauses and before and after relative clauses, full stops, semi colons and colons, brackets.
- Spelling
- Check that you have used a variety of sentence spider openers.
- Use your neatest handwriting when publishing

When you have finished editing, please publish your work using your neatest handwriting and including all of your corrections. You can add pictures too if you would like!
