



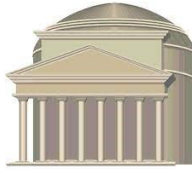

Why were the Romans significant to Europe?

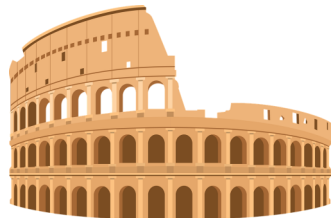

Expert knowledge:

- The Romans lasted for over 2000 years! Rome was founded in 753 BC and the roman empire fell in 1453 AD. That's 2206 years!
- The Romans enjoyed a rotten fish sauce called 'garum'. They covered their food in it similar to how we have tomato ketchup.
- Britain was conquered by the Romans in AD 43, and they ruled here for nearly 400 year. They founded cities like London, Colchester, Bath and Winchester.
- Romans spoke Latin, a language which isn't spoken anymore. We use lots of words taken from Latin such as village, picture, flame language and school.



English:
