Expert knowledge:

- Alfred became king in AD871 when his elder brother died.
- A century is 100 years and that 0-99AD is the first century
- The acronyms AD, BC, BCE and CE and what they stand for
- The names of the 7 Anglo-Saxon kingdoms: Northumbria, Mercia, East Anglia, Essex, Kent, Sussex, and Wessex
- The chronology from Romans to Normans in Britain
- Propaganda is biased or misleading information intended to promote a political cause or point of view.
- To help protect his kingdom from Viking attacks, Alfred built forts and walled towns known as 'burhs'.
- Alfred died in 899 and was buried at his capital city of Winchester.

Maths:

- use simple formulae

- divide numbers up to 4 digits by a two-digit whole number using the formal written method of long division and short division, and interpret remainders as whole number remainders or fractions
- solve number and practical problems that involve all of the above

Science: Light

- recognise that light appears to travel in straight lines.
- use the idea that light travels in straight lines to explain that objects are seen because they give out or reflect light into the eye.
- explain that we see things because light travels from light sources to our eyes or from light sources to objects and then to our eyes.
- use the idea that light travels in straight lines to explain why shadows have the same shape as the objects that cast them.

- Christians believe: Jesus is in Heaven, death is not the end, God is worshipped constantly in Heaven, when Jesus returns, heaven will come to Earth and everything will be as God intended, they will go to Heaven when they die.
