Jubilee

History:

To learn about their traditions of GB, including;

languages, flags, capital cities, foods, landmarks, clothing, emblems, important people and inventions.

 Historic stories and their impact eg Finn McCool and the Giant's Causeway/ Nessie the Loch Ness Monster/ The Mousehole Cat.

Geography:

- To identify seasonal changes
- To look at the local area and make comparisons to other places in Great Britain eg Esher and Cornwall

Science:

- To observe seasonal changes and recognising signs of spring
- To recognise the effects of spring on nature and animals
- To make comparisons between winter and spring

Computing:

 To learn to develop coding skills through Espresso Coding eg making

English:

- To use stories eg Katie in London, There's no such thing as Nessie and Dragon Post to stimulate their writing in giving instructions, recounts and letter writing
- To ask questions using question words and a?
- To use the prefix un in their writing
- To develop their blending skills through Little using Wandle, Letters and Sounds revised
- To take a closer look at non-fiction books and their features.

Art:

- Andy Warhol inspired flower pictures: collage with paint
- Henri Matisse: leaf collage
- Spring blossom paintings
- To design and create our own flags/ Great Britain posters
- To look at the works of British Artists

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Maths:

- To solve one step problems in addition and subtraction including simple arrays.
- To know and recognise the value of different denominations of coins and notes
- Count in multiples of two and ten
- Identify two more and two less than any number to 20
- To compare, describe and solve practical problems for mass, capacity and volume

RE:

 What is a Church? Looking at the furniture, exterior features, roles and responsibilities in a Church.

PSHCE:

- To investigate why we feel the way we do and what can we do to help ourselves when we feel in that way.
- To consider the feelings of sadness, happiness, feeling angry and feeling scared.

PE:

- To develop skills relating to direction, distance and space
- To develop skills of travelling, stillness, balance, turning, rolling, climbing, swinging, weight on hands, placing apparatus and jumping.
