

Key vocabulary:

Literacy:

- Listening to sounds around us, stories and rhymes
- Reading rhyming books and playing rhyming games
- Recognise familiar signs and logos
- Recognising and writing my name
- To begin to recognise and write some letter sounds
- To introduce letter families for handwriting e.g. curly caterpillar letters

Understanding the world:

- To know some similarities and difference between others at school
- To know how food is harvested
- To recognise and record signs of autumn
- To talk about talk about the lives of people they know e.g. their family

Physical Development:

- PE fundamental movement skills improving our special awareness
- Tummy time to strengthen our core muscles

Communication and Language:

- Talk about ourselves and our families
- Learning about our class friends and asking questions
- Learn about our teachers and ask them questions

RE:

- To understand why we celebrate harvest and how why it is important to share with those less fortunate

- To know how Hindus celebrate Diwali and why

Maths:

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- Counting to 10
- Counting objects one at a time and knowing which group has more or fewer
- Simple repeating patterns
 - Understanding the numbers 1, 2, 3 in detail:

Recognising, writing, ordering, subitising, circles, semi circle, triangle, sphere, hemisphere, cone and cylinder

PSED:

- Learning our class rules and routines
